
the legend Bharat Ratna Pandit Ravishankar and Sangeetha Acharya Thiruvaiyyaru S.R. Krishnan.


Sankari Krishnan

Her Guru's value enriching guidance for more than two decades enabled Sankari to become a highly accomplished and a well-respected musician.



Sankari, M.A. M.Phil is a gold medalist from the University of Madras and an "A" GRADE artist of All India Radio. Her performances at all prestigious Sabhas in India and concert tours in US, Europe, Singapore and Malaysia, have won her many laurels. Further, Sankari has been conducting many workshops for musicians belonging to different genres and countries both in India and abroad. She has been successfully doing many interactive performances with reputed Western Musicians. She has also released a number of thematic Classical and Devotional compact discs.

Besides being an accomplished performer, Sankari is also a committed teacher. He also has a refined palate for eclectic home-made foods, ranging from traditional South Indian cuisine to newly concocted soups and salads.

Born and raised near the gorges and hills of Torrey Pines, Sanjai happens to share many traits with the famous trees of the region. He is supportive, strong, resilient, and the tallest member of the Subramanian family.

Sanjay Suresh - violin



Sanjay Suresh began training in Carnatic vocal from his mother Vanitha Suresh at age 3 and in violin from Sri. C.N. Srinivasa Murthy (disciple of Sri. Lalgudi Jayaraman) at age six. He has been under the aegis of Sangeet Samrat Chitravina N. Ravikiran since age 9 and was presented in his arangetram in a unique manner

by his guru as both solo violinist (with Mrdangam stalwart Mannargudi Easwaran & Kanjira exponent Sri. B.S. Purushottam) and accompanist (for Sikkil C. Gurucharan) in Chennai, India in Brahma Gana Sabha's Music Festival on July 30, 2017. A freshman in Middleton High School, WI, Sanjay was also awarded the exemplary soloist award for Western Violin in 2019. Sanjay has won numerous prizes in Cleveland, has performed solo and accompanied in the Chennai music season, and has accompanied several leading artistes including his Guru, in the US and India.

Raamkumar Balamurthi - Mridangam



Ravi has expanded the envelope of using the Ghatam in music, when he presented special "GhataTarang" concerts with seven Ghatams as the lead melody and percussion instrument for the first time outside India. Ravi has had the rare honor and experience of performing with leading artistes including Sangitha Kalanidhi vocalists, violinists, autists, and mridangists in India, USA, Canada, Singapore, Malaysia, and Australia.
